♥♥♥♥Coach's Corner ~ Positive Self Talk♥♥♥♥

As we prepare for another season of bowls, our Coach's Corner section returns. This month, let's give them something to talk about - positive self talk. Various scenarios present themselves in a match and the way we deal with them can greatly impact the outcome of the next shot, the end, or the game. Remember ~~ bowls is 20% physical/talent and 80% mental.

When you only have one bowl in the head, the biggest and most common fear is losing a 'big end'. You might immediately tell yourself ~~~ "don't hit your only bowl in the head". Here's the problem ~~~ your brain sub-consciously does NOT recognize the word "don't" ~~ instead, you just painted a visual picture of your bowl as the target with the phrase "hit your only bowl in the head". Choose your self-talk wisely! Tell yourself ~ "I'll draw in another" or "I can draw closer with my backhand".

Your brain is tricky. When you are on the mat, ready to delivery the bowl, and you tell yourself "don't be short" ~ your brain doesn't hear the word "don't", it only hears, "be short". Often times, your bowl will come up short. In this case, your self-talk should be "I've gotta be there" or "I'll throw through the head". Subconsciously, you'll hear "be there" and "head".
