A Time For Remembering



Here's something' else to talk about


We'll be running a variety of club tournaments – sign up for one, or two, or all of them – maybe you'll win a pin at the Club windup!

The Competitive 3s league will be running again this season. The Competitive 3s league was originally designed to get competitive teams ready for Provincial Competition. But, the league has developed into much more than that. It's become a tradition at the RLBC.

Here's the Scoop

- Create a team of 3s (that's triples), mix or match (that means all women, all men, or some of each). If you want to make a team of 4 or 5, that works too, but usually only 3 play. 4 can play, you just throw fewer bowls each.
- 3 bowl triples.
- Give your team a name. Come on, make it cute. If you can't think of a name, the organizers will think of one for you. But you probably won't like it.
- Submit your team entry. We have a team entry form below. Or you can email your team entry to the organizers. Just include all the information required (see form).
- It's really fun if the members dress like a team. You know, just like at provincials when you wear the same shirt. No, not sharing 1 shirt . . . when you all wear similar shirts. You know what we mean.
- Cost – Free. It's included with your paid RLBC membership. You did take out a membership, right? It is paid for, right?
- Round robin format – unless we have more teams than days.
- 3 bowls – 16 end games.
- We'll keep stats. We might even share them with you when the Competitive 3s league concludes. And, there may be a pin for the first and second place team – handed out at the fall windup.
- Can't find a team? No problem. Let us know and we might be able to hook you up. Maybe. Possibly.
- Wanna be a sub? We always need subs. We make a list of subs and distribute it to the teams. They'll call you if they need you.
- Your team needs a sub? Sure. No problem. If your team needs a sub, you can call someone on the sub list, or you can find your own sub. Remember, the sub needs to be a member of the RLBC.

Regina Lawn Bowling Club Open Source Accessibility Project

Hello everyone,

By now, you should have received an email from me, distributed through the RLBC's communication's system. Here is a recap:

For the past few months, I have been working on a community-based research project to take place within the RLBC community. This research project, titled the Regina Lawn Bowling Club Open Source Accessibility Project, will aim to explore ways to increase the accessibility of the sport of lawn bowling for the aging members of the community. The areas of improvement include both physical and social forms of accessibility in the sport and community. I will be working with a group of up to eight RLBC volunteer members who are interested in taking part in the research project. Members with all levels of experience are welcome to participate as we will be working as a group to brainstorm some devices that may improve the physical and social accessibility within the community and the sport. Attached to the email you already received were a series of documents including a recruitment poster and a consent form. If you are interested in participating in the project, please read through the documents as they highlight the terms of the project. If you are comfortable with the terms, please sign the consent form and bring it to the first meeting (date to be determined once the participants team is formed). Emails confirming your interest in being a participant in the project may be sent to me at watson5b@uregina.ca starting **Saturday, April 9th at 8:00 pm**. As I am looking for a maximum group size of eight people to form the participants team, I will be accepting the first eight interest confirmation emails that I receive.

By default, emails are not encrypted and there is a chance that any information sent over email could be intercepted by outside sources. Therefore, please do not send any private information over email. To help protect your anonymity, we will use the phrase "Regina Lawn Bowling Club" in the subject line of all email communications.


This study has been reviewed and received approval through the Research Ethics Board, University of Regina.


