



IF THE SHOE FITS

Bobby Bowler: Ouch! My new shoes hurt.

Doug N: That's because you have them on the wrong feet!

Bobby Bowler: But these are the only feet I have!

Which reminds us Remember to wear flat shoes on the greens. Shoes with large ridges can damage our greens. Also, if you plan to win a Provincial competition which would then take you to Nationals, Bowls Canada will inspect your bowls shoes before you will be allowed to compete. If you are uncertain if your shoes will pass BCB's shoe inspection, you can send them a picture – office@bowlscanada.com. Make sure to include your name and your province. For more information, here's a snip it from BCB's website about approved footwear.

Use of Approved Footwear

Shoes must be flat-soled with no separation between the front sole and heel (i.e. flat from toe to heel). Walking shoes and sports shoes are acceptable; sandals with a heel strap are also acceptable, as long as the back strap is firmly fitted when worn. Flat-soled wedge shoes (i.e. shoes that increase in height from toe to heel) are not acceptable. The width of any heel must be at least 50% of the widest part of the sole.

The sole may possess a shallow tread pattern or indented grooves to improve traction, without damaging the green. A channel in the centre of the sole is acceptable; protuberances that extend out from the sole are not acceptable. Edges around the sole, and around any channel, need to be rounded.

Brand name bowling shoes that are listed as approved on a current list, published by a member national authority, are generally acceptable. Shoes that have been re-soled to ensure that they comply with the laws of the sport are also generally acceptable. Nevertheless, Bowls Canada Boulingrin reserves the right to disallow any specific shoe.

Umpires must use their best judgment and not unduly eliminate members from play unless they have a shoe that would clearly damage the green. Common sense must prevail.

Original meaning of a deck of playing cards:
52 cards for 52 weeks in the year.

2 colors for day and night

4 suits for the 4 seasons and 13 weeks per season.

Twelve court cards representing the 12 months.

If we add each of the cards (ace + ace + ace + ace + two + two + three + seven + eight ... and etc) of the game we will get 364.

The card game is an agricultural calendar that told us about the weeks and the seasons.

With each new season, it was King's week, followed by Queen's week, Jack's and so on until AS week changed seasons and we started over with a new color.
