

Travel Tips & Tricks

For our many Regina bowlers who will be travelling across Canada to compete, there are some easy things you can do to ensure you are at your peak performance. These Travel Tips & Tricks work for those who are accompanying the athletes too!

- ✚ **Water, Water and more Water.** If travelling by Air, remember that airplanes have low humidity and can dehydrate you quickly. Rule of thumb . . . drink 1 cup of water for every hour in flight. Remember . . . caffeine has a mild diuretic effect so try to avoid coffee, tea, and soft drinks. If traveling by land, you still need to stay hydrated. Drink lots of water – H₂O is the key!
- ✚ **Events Eats.** It's so much fun to eat out while travelling – let's face it, that's one of the main reasons we travel. No cooking! No dishes! But . . . remember ~ restaurant portions are usually larger than you would serve at home. Health advisors suggest splitting a meal with a friend or ordering an appetizer (or two) rather than a full meal. Food for thought!
- ✚ **Snacki-Snacks.** Snacks are super important. Consider bringing with you or buying when you arrive at your destination snacki-snacks such as: trail mix, dried fruit, jerky, granola bars, pretzels, nuts and seeds, sport bars, sport drinks, microwavable popcorn (most hotels and B & Bs provide microwaves). Of course, stopping at the local market and picking up a variety of fruits and raw veggies is a given!
- ✚ **Have you got the moves?** Whether travelling by air or by car, movement is key. In a plane, get up and walk up and down the aisles of the plane. When in a connecting airport, walk around as much as possible. When travelling by car, stop frequently to stretch your legs.
- ✚ **Time's a Ticking.** Adjust to your new time zone as quick as you can. Changing time zones can really throw you off. A rule of thumb . . . it takes one day to adjust to a one-hour time change. So, if you have a 3 hour time change, for example, count on 3 days before you feel adjusted. If you are a person who is deeply affected by changing time zones, experts recommend that you adjust at home to help ease the transition. Do this by getting up one hour earlier or going to sleep one hour later (depending on the time zone change) for a few days prior to departure.
- ✚ **Sleep Well ~ Live Well.** Rest up before travelling. A good sleep is key to a good performance on the greens. So, top up your 'sleep bank' before you leave. Try and get at least an hour extra sleep a day for a few days before you depart.

SAFE TRAVELS



We don't have a Catering Director this season. But that didn't stop Judy Whiting and John Whiting from stepping up to the plate to get the job done. Judy and John, with the help with a few of their friends (aka RLBC members), organized all the meals for all the Provincial Playdowns.

First, there was the planning . . . what should we serve. Then, there was the grocery shopping . . . who has the best prices in town? Do we have coupons? Then there was the chopping, cooking, broiling, braising, seasoning, stirring, mixing and taste testing. When they were satisfied that they could provide an excellent meal, they rubber stamped it!

Not only did they cook and serve meals for every provincial playdown, but . . . they made sure the coffee was always brewed, there was boiling water in the tea pot (they added a tea bag once in a while), the ice tea was cold and the lemonade was freshly squeezed.
