

110th Group Booking

Who would be our 110th Group Booking – and would we even get 110 Group Bookings this year? It was a nail-biting challenge . . . but we did it.

Let's Give'em Pumpkin To Talk About

SCENARIO: The last bowl in the end was rolled, and two opposing bowls were fairly close to the jack. Lead Jack O. Lantern looked at the bowls, conceded the point to the other team's Lead, Candy Bag, who agreed, and Lead Jack O. Lantern went to get the rake. By the time Lead Jack O. Lantern returned, Jack O. Lantern's Skip, Dee Valish, looked at the head and thought their team's bowl was closer. Jack O. Lantern then measured the bowls and it was determined that even though Jack O. Lantern had conceded the point, in fact, Jack O. Lantern's bowl was actually shot bowl. Both sides confirmed that Jack O. Lantern's bowl was closer. None of the bowls had been put on a towel or otherwise moved prior to the arrival of the skips. So, to recap . . . Jack O. Lantern conceded the point to Candy Bag, no bowls had been moved, but, upon a later measure, Jack O. Lantern's bowl was actually shot bowl. What do they do? Who should get the point?



Law 22.3 says that "As the shots are agreed, each shot bowl can be removed from the head." But the bowls were not removed. Is the concession and agreement by Lead Jack O. Lantern and Lead Candy Bag determinative even though no bowl was placed on a towel? Or, because they were not moved, is Skip Dee Valish entitled to call for a re-measure?

Actually, this situation happens more often than you might think. The player who has responsibility to determine the shot count is the **Lead** in Pairs, **Second** in Triples and **Vice** in Fours. The Skips are not responsible for determining shot bowl(s). So, when Skip Dee Valish came to the head and determined that their team had shot bowl, it didn't matter. The two Leads had already agreed on shot bowl. And, there is no law in the Bowls Rule Book that states that shot bowls must be removed from the head – although this is generally done. Therefore, the original decision stands.

You can continue to make memories as a bowler for many, many years.



- ✦ AGM – Saturday, November 5 at 1:00pm.





Registration Option #1: Pay \$100.00 for the entire season (Nov – April).


Registration Option #2: Pay \$15.00 to be a member of Bowls Sask and then \$10.00 every time you drop in.
