Coach's Corner

Ooops I did it again


Have you ever seen a team start raking or kicking bowls out of the head before the measure is done? Have you ever seen a vice or lead announce the count and grab the jack before the other team has agreed to the points? Have you ever seen a vice kick out the closest bowls, but not put them in a group or on a towel or on a hat – and then forget which bowls and how many counted? That's all fine and dandy if both teams agree to the shot and points scored. But, if you are a little too hasty, it can really cause some problems.

As a good practice, always check with your opponent which is shot bowl, 2nd shot, etc., before touching the bowls. If you or your team are scoring more than one shot, put down a bowls towel, a hat or identify the bowl as the start of a group of bowls to be counted. As a lead, don't get too hasty. Wait for the jack to be picked up by your team or your opponent's team before raking. By all means, have the rake ready to scoop up the bowls . . . but don't start raking until your vice or skip give you the nod or until you and the other team's lead agree.


Not only is it considered good etiquette, but, it may save some embarrassment if you or your opponent disagrees with the count.

So what should you do if the jack is picked up before the teams agreed to the count, or, if a bowl is kicked out of the head that may have been a counter? Well, you can call the Umpire to see what she or he may suggest. In some cases, you will be asked to go back to the previous end, where you agreed upon the score, and replay the end in question. Or, the umpire may suggest that the team who hastily grabbed the jack or kicked out a potential counting bowl will have to concede that bowl as a counter.

Adventures of A Bowls Road Trip Warrior

Dear Diary.

Well, I have to say, I sure have had an exciting summer touring around Canada and visiting all the great lawn bowls clubs across the country. All the friendly people I met . . . all the great bowling I saw . . . life just doesn't get much better than that!

Some lawn bowls clubs showed great spirit and determination as they overcame obstacles which the past couple of years presented.

For example

One club lost 75% of its members and they are really struggling to find board directors, volunteers, and ways to build back its membership. They said that Open Houses are a great way to attract new members, advertising locally helps, and hopefully every current member brings one or two friends to join. The squirrel infestation in the clubhouse didn't help – and their main priority this summer was to address the squirrel problem. I didn't go into too much more details about that – the member was a bit 'squirrely' about the situation.

Another club could not stay open at all these past 2 years. The Membership decided it was safer not to bowl, and so there was next to no activity at that club. When things started to improve, the returning members (and there weren't many) were met with a clubhouse that had been vandalized so badly that the city had to condemn it. The pipes were cut and taken, the electrical wires were stripped, the flooring had been removed, the kitchen taps are now located in someone else's home. It was a mess and such a shock and disappointment. But this didn't stop the members. They turned their equipment shed into a clubhouse (well, they set up a table and two chairs) and are petitioning the city to help them. Oh, did I mention, their biffies are located in a park next to the bowling greens (about a block away) and well, the word 'nasty' comes to mind. Actually, the word 'nasty' is an understatement.

Another club started its beautification project a couple of years ago by installing beautiful laminate flooring in their clubhouse. And then C***d happened. They lost the majority of their membership and are struggling to keep their club open with only 20 members joining this season. They play bowls 3 times a week. They can't host school groups, corporate groups or run a B Cubed rec league because they only have 10 sets of spare bowls. They are really struggling.

I found one lawn bowls club tucked away behind a block of homes. The volunteers were busy cutting the grass when I arrived. The grass used on their greens was typical back-yard grass; they were using a regular lawn mower to cut it and they were raking the clippings with a typical yard rake. They told us the story about how the lawn bowling club came to be. Way back when . . . every home in the square block gave up a portion of their back yard to start a lawn bowling green, and it has been a going concern ever since. Oh, and by the way . . . they run a short mat league in their clubhouse during the winter months. I wonder if they call it the Cathedral Short Mat?



One lawn bowling green flooded in the spring, and as far as I know . . . it's still flooded. I don't think there will be much bowling on that green this year. Last I heard, they were offering 1 hour sight-seeing boat tours, Gillian Island Style, on their greens. Nothing gets them down - their spirits aren't dampened (pardon the pun).

Another club rep told me about a great idea they have to raise money for their club. Each member who joins has to work a certain amount of bingos at their community bingo hall, and every month the bingo hall cuts the club a cheque. This money helps to keep their clubhouse open, pays some bills, buys some fertilizer and gas for their equipment. Their volunteer Greenskeeper asked if there was money in the budget to get the grass cutter blades sharpened – maybe next year.

A member at one club saw our B Cubed / RLBC bowls towels. He said, and I quote “*Those are the BEST lawn bowls towels I've ever seen.*” So I sold him one.

At another club I visited, they said that their daily draws are declining. So, they started “Coffee and Chat”. Members and their significant others arrive at the clubhouse at about 10:00am every Tuesday morning. They put on the coffee and make a pot of tea, enjoy a cookie, and they chat. Then, after about 30 minutes, the bowlers have a game. They said this is slowly bringing the daily (now weekly) draw back to life AND it provides a guaranteed social time once a week. I wonder if the RLBC should try that next year?

As I turned my car around, heading back to Regina, I began to ponder and think about how great we have it at the Regina Lawn Bowling Club. We have 4 greens which are well manicured (kudos to Darren and Trystan). We are located in a beautiful park with trees, shrubs and flowers. We have a welcoming clubhouse for our members and guests. We can roll bowls to great music 3 times a day, 7 days a week. We have a great summer student running our clubhouse (that's you, Alex). We have an awesome board of directors who spend countless hours both on and off the greens working for the members to ensure we have a great place to bowl, exciting club tournaments to bowl in and who organize other fun events. We have B Cubed ~ and B Cubed is bringing in tons of coin.

If I learned one thing on my bowls road trip (and I learned a lot), it's that lawn bowlers have a certain 'drive' and a certain attitude and they can always 'draw' to sensible and reasonable conclusions. They always look on the bright side!



Even though I had a blast visiting the other lawn bowls clubs in Canada, my bowls ♥ belongs to the RLBC. There really isn't a better place to bowl than in Regina. I realize that now (as if there was ever any doubt).

**110th Day – Friday Night Jitney
September 9**

**Mark your calendars ~ you won't want to miss our 110th
day at the RLBC.**

There may be prizes.

So you want to be an umpire . . . eh?

Matt and Jack are playing Singles in the Provincial Playdowns. There is an umpire (you) on site. It is late in the game. Matt throws his 3rd bowl of the end and runs after it, but, the bowl reaches the head before Matt does. He's simply not fast enough. Jack verbally 'warns' Matt that if he is going to run after his bowl, he must reach the head before the bowl stops rolling. Next end, same thing happens. Matt rolls his 3rd bowl, runs after it, but does not reach the head before his bowl comes to rest. Again, Jack verbally 'warns' Matt that if he is going to run after his bowl, he has be at the head at the same time or before the bowl comes to rest. The next end, the same thing happens, AGAIN. Matt rolls his 3rd bowl, runs after it, and does not reach the head by the time the bowl stops rolling. Jack comes down to the head and removes the bowl and places it on the bank. Matt is furious because he claims that Jack had no right to remove the bowl. Also, Matt's 3rd bowl was shot bowl, and now that it has been removed, he is down 3 and will likely loose the game. Matt calls the umpire (you). What do you do?

Answer. You are a very clever and very skilled umpire and you know exactly what to do. Since you know that the Umpire is the ONLY person who can remove a bowl from the head in a case such as this, you instruct Matt to put the bowl back to its original position because the conversations only took place between the athletes and they did not consult with the umpire | ie: the umpire did not warn Matt about his infraction because the umpire had no knowledge of it – according to Law 37.1.4 of the Umpire's handy-dandy guide. You also warn Matt – that as per section 13.3 of the Crystal Mark Third Edition play book

13 Possession of the rink

- 13.1 Possession of the rink will belong to the player or team whose bowl is being played.
- 13.2 As soon as each bowl comes to rest, possession of the rink will transfer to the opposing player or team after allowing time for marking a toucher as soon as it comes to rest.
- 13.3 If the umpire, either by their own observation or on appeal by one of the skips or opponents in Singles, decides that the players in possession of the rink are being interfered with, annoyed or distracted in any way by their opponents,
 - 13.3.1 the first time this happens the umpire must:
 - 13.3.1.1 warn the offending player, while the skip is present; and
 - 13.3.1.2 tell the coach, if they are present, that the player has received a warning.
 - 13.3.2 on each occasion after this, the umpire must have the bowl last played by the offending player or team declared dead. If that bowl has disturbed the head, the opponent must choose whether to:
 - 13.3.2.1 replace the head;
 - 13.3.2.2 leave the head as altered; or
 - 13.3.2.3 declare the end dead.

So there!. Good advice – you handled another sticky situation perfectly.


