Isn't there some kind of an award for that??????

Have you ever looked at the Wall of Fame and the Wall of Plaques and all the Trophies and wondered how they came to be? Well, there is a story behind each one. You might be interested to know the history of some of the trophies.

The **MINTZ** trophy was created and presented yearly to the RLBC winning Mixed Fours team in the club tournament. The MINTZ trophy, which was retired in 1998, was donated by Sadie Mintz.

The **BLAXALL** trophy was awarded to the winning RLBC Novice Triples Team. Although we can't be certain about its history, sources say it could have been donated by Mr. George Fowler Blaxall. Mr. Blaxall was born in Kent, England in 1885 and passed away in Yorkton at the tender age of 106 years. His obituary stated that he had been a member of the Victoria Lawn Bowling Club in Regina as well as a member of the Regina Carpet Bowling League. The BLAXALL trophy was retired in 2000.

The **NEWIS** trophy was awarded to the RLBC's Ladies' Pairs team. Our historians claim that the trophy was probably donated by Mr. William Thomas Newis. Mr. Newis was a long-time member of the Regina Lawn Bowling Club and its orchestra. Yes, you read that right – RLBC had an orchestra! The NEWIS trophy was retired in 1999.

The **REG SETTER** trophy was awarded to the 70+ RLBC Seniors team every fall. The trophy was created and donated by long-time club member, Reg Setter and his wife, Vivian. The REG SETTER trophy was retired in 2014 and was replaced by the **DON DANTER** trophy, sponsored by RLBC Youth – Brandon Watson, Jordan Kos and Carter Watson.

Jack McKellar donated the **MCKELLAR** trophy which was awarded to the RLBC Club Singles Champ. Mr. McKellar won 7 club championships. This trophy was retired in 1991.

The **DEWALD** plaque was hand crafted by David Ackerman and awarded to the RLBC Competitive Mixed Pairs champions. The tournament began in 2008 to honor long time member and very competitive bowler, Laura Dewald. This plaque is still active today.

Our most recent addition is the **B CUBED** Trophy. We all know what that's about! The B Cubed Trophy was designed, hand crafted and donated by Brandon Watson.

There are several other plaques and trophies in the lower level of the RLBC clubhouse. Next time you are at the clubhouse, stop and have a look. Which one has your name on it?


Brewin' with the Board and Stuff

Group bookings are a large part of the RLBC's revenue source. Group bookings also provides a lot of exposure to our sport from community members who might not otherwise understand what a great thing we have going on at the RLBC.

The Group Bookings Director position can easily be divided into many smaller jobs. You could pick the job that best suits you. Just a reminder, our Group Bookings Admin person looks after all group bookings from early May until the end of August. So the volunteer leaders only have to look after Group Bookings at the very beginning of the season and in September.

What does a typical Group Bookings volunteer do in the leadership role?

- 1. Check the phone messages and emails from potential groups who might want to book our facility.
- 2. Make the booking and provide the organization or school with some basic information, which is already created for you in a template.
- 3. Find volunteers to help when the group arrives to bowl.
- 4. Find volunteers to set up the greens and take them down before and after the group booking bowlers attend.
- 5. Invoice the group.

Food Facts for Athletes

Here are some interesting food facts from the well known nutritionist – U Rock Girl!

Eat Enough. It's surprising how many athletes don't eat enough before playing sports. Inadequate calorie intake will result in reduced performance and an increase risk for injury!

Brain Freeze

Things are not always as they appear

Solve this:

A set of bowls and their sling together cost \$1.10. Okay, that's a really cheap set of bowls. But for purposes of our Brain Freeze this month . . . humour me. So, the bowls cost a dollar more than the sling. How much does the sling cost?

What's your answer?

The answer might seem obvious. How many said – the bowls cost \$1.00 (and where can I purchase a set) and the sling costs 10 cents. What if you were told – that's not correct. Nearly everyone's impulse is to say that the sling costs 10 cents, therefore, subtract 10 cents from \$1.10 – the bowls must cost \$1.00.

But, if you really think about it . . . if the bowls cost \$1.00 and the sling costs 10 cents, the bowls don't actually cost a dollar more than the sling. In fact, the bowls only cost 90 cents more than the sling.

We didn't get the answer wrong because it was a difficult problem. We got the answer wrong because we jumped to conclusions before thinking the problem through.

This same thing happens in bowls.

You might think Oh, I'll just draw in for two. That's the obvious shot. But is it? What if there is a better shot to play? What if you don't make that shot and you end up giving up a big count to your opponent. What if your opponent has last bowl and your shot for two actually sets up your opponent for a shot for five.

Before you make your shot, take an extra second or two to see all the possibilities. Think outside the box – not what is obvious. Yes, sometimes the obvious shot is the right shot. But sometimes, it's not.



B Cubed Membership: You bowl on Thursday nights as part of the B Cubed league for 8 weeks. Costs \$100.


Jitney Membership: You bowl every Friday night from the time the season starts until the season ends. Costs \$50.




RLBC's Communication Keeping You Informed
