



As bowlers, whether we are new bowlers, social bowlers or competitive bowlers, we have a personal bias about the bowls bias.

What? Me? Biased? Never!

But it's true. We hear people talk. And they must be right . . . look at the success they've had.

How many times have we been told . . . if you're a lead, use a narrow bias bowl because you are just trying to get a bowl in the head. If you're playing back end, you need a wide bias bowl because you need to get around things.

Is this true?

Ask anyone and they'll tell you.

But, really, its just a matter of opinion – your own bias about the bowls bias.

When choosing the right bowl for you, try different bowls with different biases and see how they roll and where they land. If you don't like their hook at the end, or you prefer a straighter bowl . . . then switch.

Luckily, at the RLBC, we have many different sizes and biases for you to try. Why not try a few and see if your bias changes?





- 3. Trust the process.
- 4. Practice visualization.
- Have a routine.

Now, I line up for bowl and shoe inspection, and my shoes don't pass. How is this possible? How come my shoes were good enough before, but not now?

Well, we asked a national umpire and here's what we were told.

A friend of mine is an expert in making clown shoes. It's no small feat!

Shoes that are not flat can pick up gravel from the parking lot because not all bowlers put their playing shoes on just before they step on the greens. This gravel or debris can change the green and cause a bowl to roll funny. The Host Clubs for Canadian Championships (and the host club for Provincial Playdowns) are supposed to provide top notch greens for competition. The players expect it! So, there can't be pebbles or debris on the greens from your shoes that might have deep grooves — even though you wore them previously on the same greens in which you are not competing. Practicing on the greens (and tracking debris onto the greens) is one thing Actual competition is another. Make sense? Well, this is what head umpires told us so yeah.

I've run a shoe repair shop with my friend for years. He's my sole mate!!

If you are going to a national event, and you are concerned that you shoes may not pass inspection, you can send a picture to Bowls Canada for pre-approval – or – you can ask one of the umpires when you arrive at your destination.



Bowl Me Over




